Early in 1955, an Ajax Training Package assigned to B Battery, 1<sup>st</sup> AAA Msl Bn arrived from Ft. Bliss. It was stationed, along with other critical personnel, at PI-92, near North Park, PA. In September 1956, PI-92 was reassigned to the 74<sup>th</sup> AAA Msl Bn. In 1956, another Ajax Training Package arrived at Irwin Pennsylvania and was assigned to B Battery, 1<sup>st</sup> AAA Msl Bn. B Battery quartered and trained with C Battery (PI-36) at Irwin Pennsylvania while the site near Herminie was being constructed.

Late in 1957, Air Defense site PI-37, at Herminie Pennsylvania was officially activated. It was part of **ARAACOM** (Army Anti-Aircraft Command), and its designation was **B Battery**, 1<sup>st</sup> **AAA Msl Bn**. It was part of the Pittsburgh 18<sup>th</sup> ADA Grp., headquartered at South Park, PA.

B Battery was one of 12 Nike Air Defense sites defending Pittsburgh. It was armed with the Nike Ajax, the world's first operational, guided Surface to Air Missile. This missile carried high explosive warheads and had a range of around 30 miles with a ceiling of 70,000 feet.

In March 1957, **ARAACOM** was redesignated United States Army Air Defense Command (**USARADCOM**). In 1961, **USARADCOM** was shortened to **ARADCOM**.

In September, 1958, the Unit at the Herminie Nike site was redesignated as **B Battery**, 3<sup>rd</sup> Msl Bn, 1<sup>st</sup> Artillery Regiment.

In the fall of 1959, B Battery personnel were sent to Ft. Bliss, Texas, for Conversion Package training for the new Nike Hercules missile. The Hercules had the capability to attack formations of supersonic aircraft with nuclear warheads at a range of around 90 miles and an altitude up to 150,000 feet. Beginning in 1962, the Improved Nike Hercules System with its greater range and accuracy was introduced to B Battery.

In 1959, 1<sup>st</sup> Artillery Regiment was redesignated as **1<sup>st</sup> Artillery**.

In 1971, the 1<sup>st</sup> Artillery was renamed 1<sup>st</sup> Air Defense Artillery.

The Herminie Nike site was deactivated in June, 1974.

Over the period of its operational years, from 1955 to 1974, B Btry was manned by an estimated 1,500 Regular Army personnel.
